

We're on a mission to support researchers in developing treatments, and a cure, for diabetes.

During our quarterly meeting March 15, Minnesota Lions Diabetes Foundation trustees approved three grants totaling \$76,000.

Supporting University of Minnesota Research

MLDF trustees approved a total of \$70,000 for research at the University of Minnesota. \$35,000 was awarded for research about which future islet transplantation clinical trial would be best for an individual (decision based upon strength and nature of transplant recipient immune system), and \$35,000 was awarded for research focused on understanding the origins of autoimmune diabetes.

Supporting Youth at Camp Sweet Life

Trustees also approved a grant of \$5,000 to support Camp Sweet Life scholarship fund. Camp Sweet Life is a non-profit organization that provides youth who have Type 1 Diabetes (T1D) an opportunity to connect with other kids who have T1D, learn how to take better care of themselves, and have loads of fun in a carefree summer camp environment.
